

FOREWORD

This Comparative Philippine Word-list by Dr. Cecilio Lopez was sent to a printer for immediate printing in 1953 several months before the opening of the Eight Pacific Science Congress which was held that year at the University of the Philippines from November 16 to 28. It was planned that copies of this word-list would be distributed at the Congress to mark the first time linguistics was introduced and given a separate section in said Congress.

However, due to printing difficulties, caused primarily by a few linguistic symbols and diacritical marks, the printing of the word-list was not finished.

Inasmuch as the printing of the word-list had to be postponed indefinitely, Dr. Lopez decided to revise and expand it and to give it a new format. He also wrote a new introduction to it.

Dr. Lopez prefers this new word-list instead of the old one to be printed.

While waiting for the new word-list to be printed, we thought it would be useful to publish the original word-list in mimeographed form. We knew that quite a number of students, researchers, scholars and teachers in Philippine linguistics had long been waiting for this word-list to come out. We were happy that Dr. Lopez gave us his permission to publish this word-list as the

first special monograph issue of <u>THE ARCHIVE</u>, the first journal of Philippine linguistics which he helped us to revive.

The mimeographing of this word-list was finished early in 1972; however, due to unforseen problems, the printing of its cover was delayed for two years. We are happy, nevertheless, to have succeeded in putting this word-list out in time to mark the seventy-sixth birth month of Dr. Lopez.

We take this opportunity to thank a very good friend and teacher (who wishes to remain anonymous) who contributed the sum used for the printing of the cover of this word-list. --E.C.
