THE PHILIPPINE VIDEOKE PHENOMENON: CULTURE, AESTHETICS AND TECHNOLOGY IN TODAY'S GLOBALIZED COMMUNITY

The videoke phenomenon sweeping the country today is a showcase of how contemporary popular culture is shaped by the processes of globalization.
