

**Jose Nacion Endriga
(1938-2011)**



Jose N. Endriga had been the dean of the National College of Public Administration and Governance and had held many other administrative positions at the University of the Philippines (among them: dean of the School of Development Management, UP Visayas; director of the UP Center for Integrative and Development Studies; vice chancellor for academic affairs, UP Visayas; director of the Leadership, Citizenship and Democracy Program, UP-College of Public Administration; and vice president for public affairs). Professor Endriga was born in Davao City, and married to Dolores

Alano who was dean of the School of Urban and Regional Planning, and with whom he has five children. He earned his Bachelor of Arts, major in History (cum laude) from the University of the Philippines (1958), his MA in History from the University of Wisconsin (1969) and his MA in Public Administration from Cornell University (1974); he also took special studies in policy analysis at the Kennedy School of Government in Harvard University (1980-1981). A Fulbright-Hays awardee and a member of professional organizations for history, political science and public administration, he wrote on the history of the civil service in the Philippines, among other topics of inquiry.
